Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel September 2014

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI), in partnership with the Motor Accident Commission recently awarded further Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel. The successful applicants for September 2014 are:

Regional Development Australia – Barossa Barossa Rex Ride and Lifestyle Change	This project will deliver a cycling program incorporating a series of bicycle safety and maintenance workshops, and support for novice riders to incorporate cycling into daily transport.	\$4,520.00
District Council of Mount Barker Scooter support through RECHARGE Scheme	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will encourage mobility scooter users to use dedicated paths and trails rather than using their scooters on the roads where no footpaths exist. Mobility scooter recharge facilities will be available to allow more confidence in the use of the scooters around the Mt Barker area rather than driving cars for short distances.	\$7,600.00
Pioneers Basketball Club Safer game transport	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission, the Pioneers Basketball Club will develop a carpooling project to reduce the incidence of players and coaches driving long distances when fatigued. The project will reduce car use and provide valuable road safety outcomes.	\$10,451.00
Adelaide Farmer's Market Adelaide farmer's market share the trip	This project will encourage people to cycle, carpool and use public transport to get to the markets. The project will reduce car use, car parking pressures and congestion along Leader Street.	\$4,550.00
