



Operation Moving Traffic: Installation of Setback Bus Lanes on Anzac Highway

Operation Moving Traffic (OMT) is a South Australian Government initiative launched in 2015 to improve the efficiency, reliability and safety of the transport network, which includes both roads and public transport and extends across Greater Adelaide.

One of OMT's strategic outcomes is to increase public transport patronage and to encourage a modal shift from private car travel, which in turn requires a public transport network that focuses on key principles of service reliability, frequency, convenience and travel time.

To assist in achieving this, the department will be installing new Setback Bus Lanes which aim to improve travel time and reliability for bus services, while maintaining access to all lanes as motorists approach an intersection.

This new type of bus lane starts and stops either side of a signalised intersection, allowing buses to pass extended traffic queuing and travel through the first green signal phase during peak traffic conditions, whilst maintaining existing traffic flow capacity through the intersection. Please see attached plan for further information.

The new Setback Bus Lane will be piloted on Anzac Highway (between South Road and Greenhill Road city bound) and will be in operation from 7.00am to 10.00am Monday to Friday.

As part of these works, the existing clearway along the setback bus lane route will be removed and the existing bike lane will have the hours of operation extended to match the new setback bus lane hours. Access to properties along Anzac Highway will not be affected by the installation of this new bus lane.

Works are scheduled to occur on **Sunday 29 January 2017** between the hours of **4pm and 10pm**, weather depending.

Speed and lane restrictions will be in place in the vicinity of the works, however the road will remain open to traffic in both directions at all times.

Advance notice signage will be in place to advise motorists of the changed traffic conditions. Road users are requested to take extra care when workers are in the area and observe traffic signage and speed restrictions.
