

# Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

## Pavement Works, Mount Gambier

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

### What's happening

We are undertaking new pavement works on the Princes Highway, between Wehl Street North and Suttontown Road, to improve road surface quality. Works involve removing the existing pavement and replacing it with new asphalt.

### How this affects you

During this work Jubilee Highway West (northern carriageway) will be closed to traffic. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained on the southern carriageway at reduced speed. This traffic management will be required to remain in place outside of working hours.

Access to properties on Jubilee Highway West will be restricted for the duration of works. Impacted residents will be contacted in advance regarding access, and to discuss alternative parking options and temporary access arrangements outside of working hours.

Cyclist and pedestrian detours will also be in place throughout the area of works. Please plan your trips, drive with caution around workers and follow the directions of traffic controllers and signage. The current detour for heavy vehicles will remain in place via O'Leary Road, Pine Hall Avenue and Riddoch Highway, Mount Gambier. **No works will be undertaken on Thursday 25 April 2024 for the Anzac Day Public Holiday.**
