

I write to you on behalf of Ms Banksia Park who has raised concerns about the recent installation of yellow pavement bars along North East Road near the intersections of Asquith Street and Richards Street, Ridgehaven.

Ms Personal Affairs has informed me that the positioning of these pavement bars have created a narrow space for vehicles that are turning right onto Asquith Street or Richards Street. Thank you for your letter dated 26 May 2022, on behalf of Ms about adapting a new payment system and the option for a single-use ticket for public transport.

Adelaide Metro is currently undertaking a major ticketing upgrade designed to make public transport simpler, safer, and easier to use, to remove barriers for infrequent users.

This includes introducing an option to Tap and Pay with a Visa or Mastercard and, in future, a digital QR code. The upgrade is being implemented in stages.

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport advises that following a successful Tap and Pay pilot on trams, new smart validators have been installed on trams and O-Bahn buses. These smart validators will accept both metroCARDs and Visa/Mastercard Tap and Pay from late-2022.

Single-use MetroTickets still remain available to purchase from ticket vending machines at major interchanges, stops and stations, as well as on board trains and trams. However, single-use tickets cannot be purchased on buses, as buses moved to cashless operations during the COVID-19 pandemic.

I thank you for passing on Ms Personal Affairs comments as feedback from public transport users and the broader public plays an important role in Adelaide Metro's service improvement process as we continue to strive towards future enhancement.





Mr Clause 6 (1) - Mr Personal Affairs is concerned with the shortage of specialised truck driving instructors that has impeded his ability to obtain an unrestricted truck driving license.

Mr Personal Affairs has been attempting to complete his truck driving lessons since November last year, which costs him approximately \$1300 a lesson. He is experiencing challenges in scheduling lessons with his training provider due to bookings stretching out months on end.

Mr Personal has expressed frustration that due to the lack of training instructors, the Extended waiting times for bookings, and certain flaws within the course's structure, has led him to potentially being unable to complete his course.

Mr Personal Affairs has requested assistance from the Department of Infrastructure and Transport to assist him in obtaining an unrestricted license. He would like to be contacted by a senior officer on Personal Affairs to discuss his issue directly and would like to be informed of alternative options for him to complete his qualification.

Thank you for your letter on behalf of Mr Personal Affairs about commuters not paying for public transport.

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) advises that as a condition of the *Passenger Transport Act 1994*, any person who holds a ticket must validate his or her ticket each time that they board a regular passenger service vehicle in which a ticket validator is installed. The Department considers fare evasion as a serious and ongoing problem on the public transport network and therefore, ticket inspectors are regularly deployed to undertake fare compliance checks.

Please note, ticket inspectors do not issue infringement notices, but rather make reports to the Department's prosecutions who consider all relevant information such as the circumstances surrounding the alleged offence and any prior allegations of offences committed, prior to making a decision as to whether an infringement notice is to be issued.

The feedback provided by passengers who witness fare evasion assists when determining which services will receive the most benefit when targeting fare evasion. Accordingly, I encourage your constituent to contact Adelaide Metro via the website (<a href="www.adelaidemetro.com.au">www.adelaidemetro.com.au</a>) or the InfoLine on telephone 1300 311 108 to provide detail on the services and times observing these practices.
