

Gawler Rail Electrification Project

Works Notification

As part of the Gawler Rail Electrification Project, the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) advises that works will be undertaken in the rail corridor in Gawler.

Location: in the rail corridor adjacent Howard Street, Gawler (see map overleaf).

When: intermittently from 7am, Friday, 11 October, until 5pm, Tuesday, 15 October, weather permitting.

Activities will include:

- Relocating existing overhead power and communications cables to underground conduits.
- Installation of new, and removal of redundant, SA Power Networks poles on either side of rail corridor.

Traffic management:

- Both Howard Street and Jerningham Street will be closed to through traffic and under traffic management while these works are in progress. Both streets will be open to local traffic only while the works are in progress. Signage and traffic management will be in place to advise motorists of changed conditions. Diversions will be available via Queen Street and Victoria Terrace.
- Access to residential and business properties will be maintained at all times.

Details regarding any electricity outages will be managed and communicated by SA Power Networks. Work crews will make every effort to minimise the disturbance to residents and businesses.
