



Granite Island Causeway Project

Night Works

The South Australian Government has committed \$43 million towards the Granite Island Causeway Project to be delivered by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department). The new Causeway is being constructed next to the existing Causeway and will continue to deliver social and economic benefits to the region. It will also provide a long-term solution that is environmentally sensitive.

In order to minimise disruption to Causeway users, additional works will be undertaken on the new Causeway and within the Victor Harbor compound at night. These works will commence from **Monday, 28 June 2021**, and continue through **to late September 2021** between the hours of 5pm and 2.30am, Monday to Friday, weather permitting.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible.

The project team will continue to undertake noise monitoring during the works. Noise management measures, such as scheduling noisier tasks for completion by 10pm and the use of noise barriers, will be put in place, where required.

The scheduling of night works on the project has been carefully considered and planned so that no night works (including piling at night) are undertaken on Granite Island. This forms part of the project's mitigation measures for penguins, whales and other sensitive marine fauna. Daytime construction works will continue as currently scheduled, including piling works.

The Department appreciates your cooperation and patience while these important works are undertaken.
