

Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Westbound Rest Area Upgrade, Tantanoola

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

What's happening

We are undertaking pavement works on the Princes Highway. These works include final asphaltting and line marking and will tie into the upgraded westbound rest area and the works on the overtaking lanes.

How this affects you

To safely facilitate these works, traffic will be reduced to a single lane on Princes Highway with traffic controllers in place to control the direction of traffic. Traffic controllers will be on site to help manage the one-way flow of traffic while these works are undertaken.

Outside of work hours, lane restrictions will be removed, and traffic will be reopened to two-way traffic.

Speed restrictions will remain in place throughout the works area until all works are fully complete on both the overtaking lanes and the rest area. This includes line marking and the new road surface achieving appropriate skid resistance. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs.

Works at this location is expected to be completed in March 2024, weather permitting.
