NOTICE OF DETERMINATION – REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO DOCUMENTS UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act) which was received by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure on 12 April 2018.

You have requested access to the following:

'All files, reports, notes, emails and documents held relating to the intersection of Bridge Road and Wynn Vale Drive from 01 January 2016 to date. Not limited to, but including; traffic surveys, crash reports and expressions to upgrade the named intersection with traffic lights/traffic control. All correspondence, files, reports, notes, emails and outcomes held relating to the traffic survey as noted in Ministerial correspondence 17MTR/2039, signed by Hon. Stephen Mullighan MP, 21 December 2017 (copy enclosed).

There are 16 documents found to be within the scope of your request.

I have determined to release documents 4; 5; 6; 7; 9; 10 and 15 in full and partially release documents 1; 2; 3; 8; 11; 12; 13; 14 and 16 of the attached Schedule under section 20 (1) (a) and clause 6 (1) of Schedule 1 of the Act which states:

20—Refusal of access

- (1) An agency may refuse access to a document—
- (a) if it is an exempt document;...

6—Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead). Please note the redacted sections within the documents have been removed as they are out of scope.

In accordance with the requirements of Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045, details of your FOI application, and the documents to which you are given access, will be published in the agency's disclosure log. A copy of PC045 can be found at http://dpc.sa.gov.au/what-we-do/services-for-government/premier-and-cabinet-circulars.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

YOUR RIGHTS TO REVIEW AND APPEAL

INTERNAL REVIEW

If you are dissatisfied or concerned with the decision of this Department regarding access to documents or the request for amendment to your personal records, you can apply for an Internal Review of that decision.

To apply for an Internal Review you must write a letter addressed to the Principal Officer or lodge an Internal Review application form with the Principal Officer of this Department. The legislated application fee must accompany all applications, unless the fee was waived in the original Freedom of Information application, in which case there would be no fee payable for the application. The application must be lodged within 30 days after being notified of the decision.

The Department will undertake the Internal Review and advise you of its decision within 14 days of receipt of the application.

Where the decision was made by the Minister or Principal Officer of the Department, you are unable to request an Internal Review but you can apply for an External Review by the Ombudsman, or the District Court.

You are unable to apply for an Internal Review regarding a decision to extend the time limit for dealing with an application but you can apply for an External Review.

EXTERNAL REVIEW BY THE OMBUDSMAN OR THE POLICE COMPLAINTS AUTHORITY

After an Internal Review has been completed, or where you have been unable to apply for an Internal Review, and you are still dissatisfied with the decision you can apply for an External Review by the Ombudsman.

You may also request an External Review by the Ombudsman if you have no right to an Internal Review.

The application for review by the Ombudsman should be lodged within 30 days after the date of a determination. The Ombudsman's Office, at their discretion, may extend this time limit.

Investigations by the Ombudsman are free. Further information is available from the Office of the Ombudsman by telephone on 8226 8699 or toll free 1800 182 150 (within SA).

APPEAL TO THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN CIVIL AND ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL (SACAT)

If you are still dissatisfied with the decision made by the State Government Agency, Local Government Council or University after an Internal Review or after a review by the Ombudsman or, you can appeal to SACAT.

You must exercise your right of appeal to SACAT within 30 calendar days after being advised of the determination or the results of the review. Any costs will be determined by SACAT, where applicable. For more information, contact;

Hi Jeremy,

Attached are all the results of the recent turning count and delay survey conducted for you at the above location. The following findings may be relevant to your investigation:

- The traffic volume on Bridge Road has increased by about 8% since the previous survey in 2011, and the volume on Wynn Vale Drive by approximately 4%, representing average growths of about 1% and 0.5% per year respectively. These growth rates are fairly typical of arterial roads in the metropolitan area.
- In the period 7.00am 6.00pm, far more vehicles turned left from Bridge Road into Wynn Vale Drive than turned right from Wynn Vale Drive into Bridge Road (768 cf 443). This mismatch between 'reverse' movements is often a reflection of latent demand, ie suggests that many motorists avoid even attempting to turn right out of Bridge Road.
- The temporal distribution graphs (available on the intranet traffic information map browser) show that the peak traffic movements on Wynn Vale Drive are primarily dominated by school and commuter-generated trips.
- The queue length survey revealed that the queue of vehicles waiting to turn right from Bridge Road into Wynn Vale
 Drive reached 8 vehicles around 4.45pm, which coincides with the peak two-way commuter movements along Bridge
 Road. The lack of a sheltered right-turn lane on Bridge Road would presumably represent an appreciable risk of rearender crashes at this time.
- Queues of vehicles waiting to turn left out of Wynn Vale Drive reached 16 and 21 vehicles in the morning and afterschool afternoon peak periods respectively.
- Queues of vehicles waiting to turn right out of Wynn Vale Drive reached a maximum of five (just before 9am) and hovered around 3 4 vehicles in the after-school peak period of about 3.20 3.40pm. The relatively small maximum queue length does not necessarily imply a lack of demand for that movement, but can sometimes reflect the fact that many motorists do not even attempt that movement at those times.
- The fourth file above contains the calculations of the average delays per vehicle for the various turning movements of interest see the sheet labelled "calculated average delays" in particular. In summary these calculations show:
- Right turn from Bridge Road into WV Drive a peak delay of approximately 35 seconds per vehicle for the 15 minute increment 3.30 3.45pm, and an average delay of about 7 seconds per vehicle over the whole survey period of 6.30am 7.00pm;
- Left turn from WV Drive into Bridge Road a peak delay of approximately two minutes per vehicle for the 15 minute increments 8.30 8.45am and 3.15 3.30pm, and an average delay of about 23 seconds per vehicle over the whole survey period; and
- Right turn from WV Drive into Bridge Road a peak delay of approximately four minutes per vehicle for the 15 minute increment 3.15 3.30pm, two minutes per vehicle during 4.45 5.00pm, and three minutes per vehicle for the duration 5.15 5.45pm. [The calculated value of ten minutes per vehicle for the period 5.15 5.30pm is a 'statistical quirk' resulting from the fact that only two vehicles managed to turn right during that period]. The overall average delay for that movement over the entire survey period was 38 seconds per vehicle.
- The last file contains the field staff observations three of the records involve vehicles waiting to turn right from WV Drive during the afternoon peak period, presumably becoming frustrated, and taking alternative action two by turning left instead, and one doing a dangerous (and bizarre!) movement in order to leave the queue. Lastly, although not recorded on that sheet, observed from the videography of the junction movements that 'approximately 85% of those vehicles turning left from WV Drive failed to stop at the Stop sign'.




Traffic Volumes By Intersection Arm



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

Thank you for your letter dated 23 November 2017, on behalf of regarding the installation of traffic signals at the intersection of Wynn Vale Drive and Bridge Road, Gulfview Heights.

Proposals for traffic signals are considered using standards that have been generally agreed across Australia. A range of factors are taken into account, including traffic volumes on the major road and minor road, distance between the signalised intersections, the importance of the major road as part of the network of roads, pedestrian volumes and the crash history of the site.

I am advised the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) will undertake a review of this location, including a survey to ascertain traffic and pedestrian movements. The survey will occur in February 2018, once the new school term has commenced.

The review is expected to be completed by the end of March 2018.

Based on the results of the review, if an effective treatment option is identified for this location, a proposal will be submitted for future funding consideration under the Black Spot Program.

I trust this information is of assistance and will enable you to respond to 6(1) Personal affairs



BACKGROUND

On November 23 2017 Mr Blair Boyer the Labour candidate for Wright wrote to the Minister on behalf of 6(1) Personal affairs of Gulfview Heights who had raised concerns regards the above intersection and suggested that the installation of Traffic Signals would help with traffic flow and management.

SITE DESCRIPTION

Bridge Road is an important urban arterial route providing a direct connection to and from the northern suburbs to the city with a speed limit of 60kph and is under care, control and management of DPTI. Wynn Vale Drive is a local road under the control of the city of Salisbury and has a speed limit of 50kph.

The junction operates as a standard non signalised T junction at present. Bridge Road is a 4 lane two way road with no central median and it has a separate left turn deceleration lane Wynn Vale Drive. Wynn Vale Drive has separate left and right turn out lanes for access onto Bridge Road and is under the control of a Stop Sign. Traffic using the left turn deceleration lane into Wynn Vale Drive is required to give way to traffic turning right into Wynn Vale Drive from Bridge Road. Below is a locality plan.

ISSUES

For the period 2012 to 2016 (inclusive), three casualty crashes (all minor) have been recorded at this intersection. The majority of the crashes involved vehicles turning right from Wynn Vale Drive being hit by vehicles travelling straight through on Bridge Road. This crash history of three casualty accidents in a five year period does warrant further investigation in relation to possible "Black Spot Funding".

The most recent 11 hour traffic survey was undertaken in 2011. At that time the results indicated the warrant for traffic signals at this location based on Traffic Volumes was not met. To assist in the "Black Spot Funding" investigation it is recommended that a new 11 hour traffic survey be undertaken. This survey cannot be undertaken until February 2018 after school holidays finish and traffic flows return to normal levels...

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following information be included in a response:

- An initial review of the site operation has been undertaken to determine if any action is required to improve traffic flow and safety.
- There have been 3 minor casualty crashes reported in the last 5 years which warrants further investigation to identify potential treatments options (which may include traffic signals) to reduce accidents.
- No recent traffic counts are available. However the previous count from 2011 shows that volumes were well below requirements for traffic signals. A new count will be arranged for February 2018 after school returns.
- The investigation is expected to be completed by the end of March 2018.
- If a cost effective treatment option can be identified then a scheme will be developed and submitted in late 2018 for consideration under the 2019/20 Black Spot program.
