Dear Resident / Business Proprietor

As you may be aware, on 5 July 2016 the State Government committed \$50 million in funding for the first stage of the AdeLINK tram network to the city's East End. The Adelaide City Council will also provide an additional \$5 million to facilitate upgrades to the public realm and to contribute to the planned East End tram stop.

Engagement with key stakeholders, property owners, tenants, businesses and residents adjacent to or close to the corridor will continue.

Project Overview

The project will deliver a one-kilometre extension of the tram network along North Terrace, from King William Street to East Terrace. It will make key sites along North Terrace and in the East End more accessible including cultural attractions, universities and restaurants.

Background

The extension forms Stage One of EastLINK tram network, with future stages planned through Kent Town to the eastern suburbs. It also marks the first stage of the CityLINK loop around the CBD.

The extension will feature three new stops servicing the museum and library precinct, universities and the Old Royal Adelaide Hospital Site.

The Government's vision for the AdeLINK tram network has been endorsed as an Infrastructure Australia priority initiative following the State Government's *Integrated Transport and Land Use Plan*. For further information please visit:

The night works will occur between the hours of:

- 7pm and 5am Monday to Thursday, and
- 10pm Friday until 7am Saturday morning.

The works will involve pavement and geotechnical investigations to provide information for the detailed design of the City Tram Extension Project.

These works are being undertaken at night in order to minimise the impact to road users and to complete the work safely and efficiently.

Speed and lane restrictions will be in place in the vicinity of the works, however the road will remain open to traffic in both directions at all times. A 25 km/h speed restriction will be in place while workers are on site.

Every effort will be made to minimise noise impacts to nearby businesses and residents. However, some noise will be unavoidable during this period.

DPTI appreciates your patience and cooperation while these important works are undertaken.
