

Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Works Update – Meningie and Tantanoola

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

What's happening:

Pavement works are required at the following sites:

- approximately 12 kilometres south of Meningie where we are constructing new overtaking lanes (northbound and southbound); and
- approximately 13 kilometres southeast of Millicent where we are constructing extensions to existing overtaking lanes (eastbound and westbound).

Works at both sites are expected to be completed in March 2024, weather permitting.

How this affects you:

To safely undertake these works, we'll have speed and lane restrictions in work areas. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs. Outside of work hours speed restrictions will remain in place subject to onsite conditions.

Following the completion of pavement works, speed restrictions at each site will remain in place until line marking is fully complete.

No works will be undertaken between Friday, 22 December 2023 and Sunday, 7 January 2024.
