FREEDOM OF INFORMATION INTERNAL REVIEW

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* ('the Act') which was received by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport on 22 July 2020 and your request for internal review lodged on 3 December 2020.

You have requested access to the following:

1. All internal and external reports, correspondence and emails regarding the 75 'stakeholder engagement activities' conducted during the Phase 2 Code consultation period, including information on participant registrations and attendance.
2. All correspondence and communications received from landowners who were notified during the Phase 2 consultation regarding Historic Area Overlays and Historic Area Statements in respect of their properties and any responses provided by DPTI or the SPC. (Reference p 193 of Phase 2 Engagement report)
3. All communications and reports regarding the distribution of 11,000 letters regarding Phase 2 Historic Area Statements.. (Reference p 203 Phase 2 Engagement Report)
4. All communications and Reports about the 'inter generational panel' engagement activity planned for the Phase 2 Code consultation period. (Reference p203 Phase 2 Engagement report.)
5. All communications and reports about the letter box drop engagement activity planned for the Phase 2 consultation period. (Reference p 203 Phase@ Engagement report)
6. All hard copy and online survey forms completed by participants in the Phase 2 Code consultation. (Reference p 204 Phase 2 Engagement report)
7. All reports, correspondence and emails about the analysis of survey forms completed by participants in the Phase 2 Code consultation.
8. Sample size data for survey results reported on pages 205 and 206 of the Phase 2 Engagement report.
9. All information, reports and correspondence supporting the findings reported on p 207 of the Phase 2 Engagement report."

On 3 August 2020 your application was re-scoped to the following:

- “1. All hard copy and online survey forms submitted by participants during the Phase 2 Code consultation- (1 October 2019- 31 March 2020). (Reference p 204 Planning and Design Code Phase 2 Engagement report)
2. All reports, correspondence and emails about the analysis of survey forms completed by participants in the Phase 2 Code consultation (1 October 2019- 31 March 2020). (Reference p 204 Planning and Design Code Phase Two Engagement report)
3. All information, reports and correspondence supporting the findings reported on p 207-208 of the Planning and Design Code Phase Two Engagement report.
4. All communications and reports regarding the distribution of 11,000 letters in respect of Phase 2 Historic Area Statements. (Reference p 203 Planning and Design Code Phase 2 Engagement Report) between 1 October 2019 and 31 March 2020.”

Determination

There are 37 documents which have been located that are within the scope of your request. I have reviewed the deemed refused status of your original application and I have determined to release four documents in full. I have determined to partially release seven documents, and refuse 26 documents in accordance with section 20(1)(a) and (b); and Clauses 6(1) and 9(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act which states:

20—Refusal of access

- (1) *An agency may refuse access to a document—*
 - (a) *if it is an exempt document; or*
 - (b) *if it is a document that is available for inspection at that or some other agency (whether as part of a public register or otherwise) in accordance with [Part 2](#), or in accordance with a legislative instrument other than this Act, whether or not inspection of the document is subject to a fee or charge; or*

6—Documents affecting personal affairs

- (1) *A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).*

9—Internal working documents

- (1) *A document is an exempt document if it contains matter—*
 - (a) *that relates to—*
 - (i) *any opinion, advice or recommendation that has been obtained, prepared or recorded, or*
 - (ii) *any consultation or deliberation that has taken place, in the course of, or for the purpose of, the decision-making functions of the Government, a Minister or an agency; and*
 - (b) *the disclosure of which would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.*

Please note some redacted sections within the documents have been removed as they are out of scope.

Clause 6(1)

Documents 009, 012, 014 and 017 contain the personal information of members of the public, the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of personal affairs. I therefore determine the information to be exempt from disclosure under clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 9(1)

Documents 002, 004-008, 011 and 016-018 are internal reports, emails, and draft documents that contain opinions and advice prepared by the agency for the purpose of the decision-making functions of the Minister. The documents contain matter relating to opinions and advice prepared in the course of the decision-making functions of the department. These documents are considered exempt under clause 9(1)(a)(i) Schedule 1 of the Act.

In considering the grounds for exemption of information under clause 9, I have considered the public interest in disclosure or non-disclosure:

Factors in favour of release

- further the objects of the Act;
- promote openness and accountability of the agency and its staff; and
- ensure administrative decisions are made on evidence;

Factors against release

- enable the free and frank discussion of opinions and advice;
- encourage the free exchange of ideas during deliberative process, including through the frank and candid assessment of information;
- ensure the effective conduct of government functions;
- draft documents are not complete works and do not contain, or have had applied, critical reviews and comments; and
- release of draft documents has a high probability of incorrectly projecting a conclusion which may not be a true and final conclusion of DPTI.

Upon weighing these factors I have determined, on balance, that it is contrary to the public interest to release the information.

Section 20(1)(b) – Documents publicly available

Documents 005 and 007 have been refused access under Section 20(1)(b) of the Act as the final copies of these documents are publicly available for inspection on the SA Government website in accordance with normal process for public consultation documentation.

Documents 019-037 have been refused access under Section 20(1)(b) of the Act as these documents are publicly available for inspection in the publications of the South Australian news outlets to which they were issued.

5 Engagement Evaluation

To ensure the principles of the Community Engagement Charter (the Charter) were met, an evaluation of the engagement process for the draft Rural Areas (Phase Two) Code occurred both during and following consultation.

Following submission closure, a survey containing six evaluation questions relating to the effectiveness of public consultation on the draft Rural Areas (Phase Two) Code was sent to 300 individuals who had lodged a written submission, via the SA Planning Portal or by email. A total of 97 responses were received, with a number providing additional comments on various questions within the survey.

During the engagement period there were numerous opportunities for councils, industry practitioners and members of the community to engage with representatives from the State Planning Commissions and Department staff to hear about the draft Rural Areas (Phase Two) Code and contribute to discussions on the planning policy for their communities. Feedback was gathered at these engagement events and recorded in master spreadsheets.

The results of the survey and an assessment of the engagement process against the Charter's principles are referenced below.

5.1 Evaluation against the Community Engagement Charter principles

The following is an assessment of the engagement activities undertaken during the public consultation for the draft Rural Areas (Phase Two) Code against the five principles of the Charter. A summary table of the evaluation responses can be found in Attachment 3 of this report.

5.1.1 Engagement is genuine

People had faith and confidence in the engagement process

People are willing to participate in future consultation on the Code

People understand what it meant for them

Overall, the engagement activities undertaken during consultation for the draft Code met this principle largely through targeted engagement activities with a wide spectrum of stakeholders using a variety of communication and consultation channels.

In the Rural Areas, direct communication was undertaken via scheduled information sessions, meetings and workshops with council CEOs, Mayors and Elected Members and information drop-ins with community members. Many attendees expressed their appreciation of these sessions being held and found them informative and helpful; however not all of them understood how their feedback will be used in the preparation of the final Planning and Design Code. 86% of people who responded to the survey indicated they would be willing to participate in future consultations related to the draft Code.

The majority of respondents from the evaluation survey felt they were genuinely engaged during the consultation period.

Feedback from Phase One was taken into account when planning the consultation approach for Phase Two and resulted in a more comprehensive program of consultation events for community and stakeholders over an eight week program as outlined in section 3 of this report.

5.1.2 Engagement is inclusive and respectful

Affected and interested people had the opportunity to participate and be heard

People were well-informed about the proposed Planning and Design Code for Rural Areas (Phase Two)

The engagement targeted and reached known stakeholders and community members who were both affected or interested in the draft Rural Areas (Phase Two) Code.

The SA Planning Portal, YourSAy website, rural council and community's information session tours and practitioner livestream events allowed the Commission and Department to reach South Australians who would not normally participate in the planning conversation.

In the Rural Areas, direct communication was undertaken with the assistance of councils to access local networks and promote the awareness about the draft Code consultation and how they could contribute to the discussions on the planning policy for their communities.

Advertising of public notices in regional and metropolitan newspapers, about the information sessions for community members, industry practitioners, community groups and interested parties lead to additional conversations with affected and interested people.

Despite this, a total of 60% of respondents 'somewhat' or 'strongly' disagreed that they were well informed.

5.1.3 Engagement is fit for purpose

People were effectively engaged and satisfied with the process

People were clear about the proposed change and how it would affect them

The aim of the engagement activities was to inform rural South Australians about opportunities to get involved in the consultation process and how it would impact planning in their communities. These activities included:

- Informing the community and stakeholders through a variety of media channels, to gain maximum reach (e.g. YourSAy website, SA Planning Portal, DPTI social media platforms (Facebook, LinkedIn and Twitter), and media release).
- Public Notices issued in The Advertiser and in 11 local papers.
- An introductory video outlining the State's new planning reform that was posted to the Departments YouTube channel as well as SA Planning Portal.
- Direct correspondence to community and stakeholder groups outlining what the draft Code would mean to them and why they should get involved in the consultation.
- Practitioner live streams and information sessions that focussed on the technical components of the draft Code and provided education while involving them in the development and adoption of the draft Code.

To support the release of the Phase Two (Rural Areas) Code a dedicated page for the consultation was established on the SA Planning Portal, the page featured a number of key guidance materials to assist in understanding the draft Code:

In the formal evaluation survey, a high number of respondents considered that they did not have an adequate opportunity to be heard, with 65% stating that they had insufficient information so that they could provide an informed view. Feedback on the Code document itself was that it was difficult and lengthy document to review, and insufficient time was given to do so.

5.1.4 Engagement is informed and transparent

All relevant information was made available and people could access it

People understood how their views were considered, the reasons for the outcomes, and the final decision that was made

People would be willing to participate in future consultations

To ensure that stakeholders were adequately informed and the process remained transparent:

- The information provided during consultation clearly articulated key matters how participants can get involved and how feedback will be used.
- All submissions were acknowledged and advised of the next steps.
- A *What We Have Heard Report Phase Two* will be emailed to all respondents who provided a written submission, and a copy will be provided on the YourSAy website, placed on the SA Planning Portal and disseminated through the Department's Planning Ahead newsletter.

86% of survey respondents would be willing to participate in future consultation, although only 27% felt well-informed about the proposed Code.

5.1.5 Engagement processes are reviewed and improved

The engagement was reviewed and improvements recommended

Feedback from engagement activities, both verbal and from the evaluation survey, was considered throughout the consultation period and improvements made to upcoming engagement activities.

The engagement plan was amended to include additional meetings and conversations with councils and community members in Rural Areas.

Department staff also attended meetings with community groups and industry groups on request throughout the consultation period.

6. Engagement Evaluation Results

In line with the Community Engagement Charter Evaluation Framework, the following section provides a summary of the performance of the engagement and consultation plan in achieving its objectives and meeting the five principles of the Charter.

6.1 Summary of Evaluation

The purpose of the engagement activities was to gain feedback on the content within the Phase Two (Rural Areas) Code and to raise awareness and understanding amongst the diverse range of community and stakeholders, and how it will be used. Overall the engagement activities elicited a mixed response with respect to the Charter.

Feedback and general comments included concern about the limited time given to the consultation process, the errors in the draft Code, and Councils ability to manage the new processes going forward.

In the evaluation survey, a high number of respondents considered that they did not have an adequate opportunity to be heard, with 65% stating that they had insufficient information within the draft Code so that they could provide an informed view.

Understanding the draft Code was a common theme. Feedback on the draft Code document itself was that it was a difficult document to review, and insufficient time was given to do so. Stakeholders found it to be confusing and difficult to provide feedback as the draft Code required a number of corrections and didn't provide a simpler outcome for understanding the changes to the new system.

It was also noted in the feedback that the consultation on the draft Code was occurring in the absence of the 'new' ePlanning solution, which created difficulties in reviewing and gaps in understanding of how the online version of the Code would operate.

The majority of respondents felt they were genuinely engaged and satisfied with the engagement activities and opportunities provided to them during the consultation period. With 86% of people who responded to the survey indicated they would be willing to participate in future consultations related to the Code.

6.2 How evaluation was collected

Following submission closure, a survey containing six evaluation questions relating to the effectiveness of the consultation process was sent to individuals who had lodged a written submission, via the SA Planning Portal or by email, as prescribed in the Community Engagement Charter. An analysis of the feedback received is summarised in the table in Section 6.3 below.

6.3 Results of the formal assessment of the public consultation






