


North-South Corridor Darlington Upgrade Project



SEWER MAIN RELOCATION FAQ'S SHEET

Why are Sewer Relocation Works being undertaken?

Utility services, including water mains and sewer mains, require relocation within the Darlington Upgrade Project site before major works commence. An upgrade to the existing sewer system is required and a change to your property's connection will be required.

How will this affect property owners?

A new connection is required between the new sewer main and your property's existing sewer connection point inside your boundary. Arrangements will be made to ensure the new connection can be established while minimising disruption to you where possible.

Access to your property will be required so that the existing sewer inspection point can be located. This will include some minor excavation. Once this inspection point is confirmed and new connection details finalised, construction works will commence. It is anticipated that this work will take approximately one week, with the actual sewer connection taking approximately 3 hours. During this 3-hour period, it will be necessary to avoid the use of household appliances that discharge to the sewer (for example toilets, washing machines and dishwashers etc.)

You will be provided 7 days' advance notice prior to the commencement of these works. Works are currently scheduled for late October/early November 2016.

To facilitate these works, a small section of your back fence will be removed to allow construction access and a temporary fence with shade cloth will be installed to delineate your property boundary and maintain security and privacy. Please see the graphic overleaf which represents a typical fencing arrangement.

What are the benefits for property owners?

The existing sewer easement within your residential property will be removed and a new sewer main will be established outside of your property boundary. This will mean that any required maintenance works can be undertaken without requiring future property access.



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
Typical Fencing Arrangement.

A small section of the back fence will be removed to allow construction access and a temporary fence with shade cloth will be used to delineate a property boundary.


