Dear Mr Koutsantonis

I refer to your application to the Office of the Minister for Transport, Infrastructure and Local Government, Minister for Planning made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act) which was received 14 June 2019. You have requested access to:

"A Copy of all documents including briefings and/or advice, minutes, notes, emails, sms's and correspondence sent to and received from Ms Nicolle Flint, Member for Boothby and/or her office regarding the Springbank Road, Daws Road and Goodwood Road intersection and proposed DPTI works from Minister Knoll and or his Office and the DPTI from 19 March 2018 to 13 June 2019."

A search of documents held by the Office of the Minister for Transport, Infrastructure and Local Government, Minister for Planning was undertaken. I wish to advise that 11 documents have been identified within the scope of your request.

Please refer to the attached schedule that describes each document and sets out my determination and reasons in summary form.

I have determined to grant partial access to documents 1-5 and 7-10. I have removed the personal contact details within these documents that I have determined is exempt in accordance with clause 6(1) of the Act which states:

6-Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).

Attached is an explanation of the provisions of the Act which details your rights to review and appeal this determination, and the process to be followed.

The government has committed to fund comprehensive works to improve traffic flows and reduce delays at the Springbank, Daws and Goodwood road intersection. In 2017–18 the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure will commence detailed design to re-align the intersection to create a standard cross intersection, which will create a more efficient intersection and eliminate much of the blocking of through traffic that causes significant congestion.

Importantly, this budget retains funds in contingency for the realignment of the Springbank, Goodwood and Daws Road intersection. As one of the houses that will be seriously impacted by the location of the proposed new road upgrade, I would like to express my concern for the safety of my family and our neighbors and their small children, the local residents living OF THE PROPOSED NEW IN MY PERSONAL OPINION, BELIEVE CONNECTING ROAD WILL BE PUTTING MY FAMILY AND OUR NEIGHBORS, THE RESIDENTS IN THE LOCAL COLONEL LIGHT GARDENS COMMUNITY AT RISK. - WE ALL HAVE SMALL CHILDREN and will be having to REVERSE OUR VEHICLES OUT OF OUR DRIVEWAYS IN PEAK HOUR, ON A BEND, INTO ONCOMING TRAFFIC (it is a potential blind spot for us all) AND VERY DANGEROUS. there is also an increased risk of cars crashing into our yards. - Obviously - At present, we just have enough time to reverse out of our properties, with clear sight of the oncoming vehicles from Goodwood Road, when the light sequences change at Springbank and Goodwood Road. -The lack of off street parking is also an issue in this section of Springbank Road since the recent upgrade of Springbank Road and the introduction of the single lane and bike lane. We have a (there is currently 1 PARKING SPACE off road for all of the houses from infront of our home and were not able to have extra car parks infront of our property during the recent upgrade of Springbank Road. * Moving the bus stop back towards the St Therese school or into the park on the corner, would also give the residents more potential off street car parking spaces if the intersection was kept at the Goodwood Road end. - Sealing the back lane would also help us, as the lack of parking and current traffic conditions , limits the access for services into our properties. (eg deliveries and lawn mower / gardners etc) could potentially De-value our property prices. Extra funding for Residential fences would help the noise / safety factor (they did this for residents on PortRush Road during their upgrade) 1

- In my opinion it makes more sense and would be SAFER to join the roads closer to the EXISTING INTERSECTION AT GOOD WOOD / SPRINGBANK / DAWS ROAD before the houses start at number There is a vacant park and school which wont be impacted by the traffic turning the corner, as the families and residents living here will be with the current plan.

* The intersection definitely needs to be upgraded but I believe it makes more sense to either RE-LOCATE where the safety of the local community wont be an issue

myself and my family reside at

Unfortunately we were unable to attend the community meeting for the upgrade of the Springbank / Daw/ Goodwood Road intersection, at St Therese School on the 13/12/2018. The flyer was only dropped 2 days prior, which makes finding a sitter for three (3) children under 11 difficult.

I have previously expressed our concerns with DPTI and Mitcham without any further contact, essentially DPTI and the Mitcham council have ignored the issues I have raised. It is frustrating as I wonder at what point will DPTI consult the residents directly and thoroughly to discuss the planning process, if at all? As a resident who is significantly and directly impacted, I am one of many residents who are KEY stakeholders in this process.

As one of the houses that will be significantly impacted by the proposed road upgrade, I would like to express my serious concern for the safety of my family, our neighbours and all children living from **Sector Sector** NOTE: there are currently approx 11 children under the age of 12 living in the mentioned area.

My and use the intersection at Springbank -Daws- Goodwood Roads, multiple times a day on our way to school/work/sport and for general daily living.

At present, we just have enough time to reverse out of our properties, with clear sight of the oncoming vehicles from Goodwood Road, during a light sequence change (at Springbank and Goodwood Road). This already proves extremely difficult with a trailer, it will be fundamentally impossible with the proposed changes.

We understand the intersection requires an upgraded, but not at the expense of my family or my neighbours families safety. Why hasn't anyone (from DPTI or Mitcham Council) discussed or attempted to address these concerns with the local residents?

In addition to the upgrade, currently there is a lack of off street parking since Springbank Road upgrade introduced single lane traffic and a bike lane. Please be note there is currently ONE PARKING SPACE off road for all residents from the strength of the strength of

Another simple suggestion could be to move the bus stop back towards the St Therese Primary School or into the park on the corner. In doing so this would also give the residents more potential off street car parking spaces if the intersection was kept at the Goodwood Road end.

Loss accidents it is common knowledge these changes will result in an increased risk to cars accidents occurring, causing significant damage to our properties. This intern could potentially de-value our properties. A simple suggestion to improve the outcome for DPTI and Mitcham council could be in the form of funding to be granted to those residents directly impacted by the upgrade. The funding could include provisions for improved fencing to assist reducing noise, whilst improving safety. An example of the DPTI and a council listening to their residences occurred when the Portrush Road was upgraded, particular sections of Portrush Road the residents that were significantly impacted by noise and or safety, received funding resulting in improved fencing and the safety for these residents coming into and out of their properties.

I would greatly appreciate a response and or a contact from someone who is involved with the project.

Thank you for your letter on behalf of second second regarding traffic in the Panorama area.

I am advised by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (the department) that while it discourages cutting through local streets, it is not illegal and can be difficult to enforce as it is a public road. Suburban roads come under the care, control and management of local government, and as such, any proposed local traffic management scheme is a matter between the local council and residents. However, as part of the Goodwood, Springbank, Daws Roads intersection upgrade project, the department will be working with local council to address this issue.

Goodwood Road is one of southern Adelaide's major north-south arterial routes, with Springbank Road and Daws Road providing a key east-west connection.

As you are aware, the Marshall Liberal Government announced a new solution to remove the dog leg at this location – saving motorists more time.

An upgraded, "staggered T" solution had been proposed, however, after community feedback, new data and detailed costings, the State Government will now deliver a new four-way intersection. This will involve road re-alignment and will be delivered within the same timeframe.

The \$60 million project is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian Governments and the upgrade will:

- improve safety and travel times for motorists;
- improve transport capacity;
- improve safety for all users;
- improve connectivity for vulnerable users; and
- support adjoining land use.

Thank you for your letter on behalf of **second second second** regarding the Goodwood, Springbank and Daws Road intersection upgrade.

The Marshall and Morrison Governments have recently announced we will remove the dog leg at the Springbank/Goodwood/Daws Roads intersection – saving motorists more time.

An upgraded "staggered T" solution had been proposed, however, after considering community feedback, new data and detailed costings, we will now deliver a new four-way intersection. The new four-way intersection is expected to cost \$60 million and is expected to be completed by 2022.

The State Government listened to the local community and we went back to the drawing board to come up with the best solution.

I thank you and your state colleague Mrs Carolyn Power MP, Member for Elder, for your strong advocacy in ensuring these safety and access issues are addressed.

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure will consult with key stakeholders and the community as the project progresses. **Sector** concerns have been noted and will be considered as the project is developed beyond the preliminary concept planning stage.

Thank you for your letter on behalf of local residents, regarding motorists cutting through local streets to avoid congestion.

I am advised by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (the department) that while it discourages motorists cutting through local streets, it is not illegal and can be difficult to enforce as it is a public road.

Suburban roads come under the care, control and management of local government, and as such, any proposed local traffic management scheme is a matter between the local council and residents. However, as part of the Goodwood, Springbank, Daws Roads intersection upgrade project, the department will work with local council to address this issue.

I thank you for inviting me to attend a Community Forum on this intersection hosted by yourself, Mrs Carolyn Power MP, Member for Elder and Mr Sam Duluk MP, Member for Waite. This was a very valuable night learning from your community about the issue of 'rat running'.

Goodwood Road is one of southern Adelaide's major north-south arterial routes, with Springbank Road and Daws Road providing a key east-west connection.

As you are aware, the Marshall Liberal Government recently announced a new solution to remove the dog leg at this location – saving motorists more time.

An upgraded, "staggered T" solution had been proposed, however, after community feedback, new data and detailed costings, the State Government will now deliver a new four-way intersection. This will involve road re-alignment and will be delivered within the same timeframe.

This \$60 million upgrade is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian Governments and will include:

- improve safety and travel times for motorists;
- improve connectivity for vulnerable users;
- improve transport capacity;

- improve safety for all users; and
- support adjoining land use.
