### We are improving flood resilience on The **Outback Highway between Lyndhurst and** Marree

The Australian and South Australian Governments are jointly funding (50/50) as part of Flood Resilience State Network.

## What's happening

Flood recovery works on The Outback Highway between Lyndhurst and Marree, are now underway.

These works are to remediate and improve sections of The Outback Highway caused by flooding associated with 2022 weather events. This includes raising the road profile, and new and improved drainage as the road is reconstructed.

The project will improve resilience of the network, benefiting and maintaining the vital connection for regional mining, primary and tourism industries and remote communities.

# How this affects you

To safely undertake these works there will be changes to existing traffic conditions. Speed and lane restrictions will be in place throughout the area for the duration of the works. Outside of working hours speed restrictions will remain in place until all works, including line marking, are complete in mid-2026.

The Outback Highway will remain open at all times. Traffic may be reduced to a single lane intermittently with traffic management in place to control the direction of traffic as required. Please follow the direction of on-site traffic controllers and observe signage.

Access for heavy vehicles will be maintained at all times.
