ADELAIDE RAILWAY STATION PLATFORM CLOSURES TO CATER FOR STAGE TWO CONVENTION CENTRE WORKS

From Friday 22 May until early 2016 there will be various closures of platforms five to nine at the Adelaide Railway Station to facilitate works for the second stage of the Adelaide Convention Centre redevelopment project.

The closures are being staged to ensure minimal impact to customers. The first closure will be a full closure of track nine from May 22 for approximately one month.

The extent and location of platform closures will vary between 22 May and early 2016 depending on the Convention Centre construction activities.

There is no reduction in services or timetable changes for the stage two works.

As a result of these works, train passengers may find their train arrives and departs from a different platform, or they need to walk further to and from the turnstiles. Passengers may also be diverted onto special walkways to move around the works.

Some passengers may experience short travel delays, particularly on the Gawler and Outer Harbor lines. Adelaide Metro apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused.

There will be signage and information in the station concourse area to assist passengers. Adelaide Metro staff will also be available at Adelaide Railway Station during peak times.

It is recommended that passengers allow time to check the station Passenger Information Screens prior to their train service scheduled departure times.
